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PORT COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE (PCAC) PROJECT INVOLVEMENT

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C.1 Introduction, PCAC Purpose and Goals

5 The Port Community Advisory Committee (PCAC) was established in 2001 as a
6 standing committee of the Port of Los Angeles Board of Harbor Commissioners
7 (Board). In accordance with the direction provided by Mayor Hahn, the purposes of
8 the PCAC are to:

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- 10 • Assess the impacts of Port developments on the harbor area communities and
recommend suitable mitigation measures to the Board for such impacts.
 - 11 • Review past, present, and future environmental documents in an open public
12 process and make recommendations to the Board to ensure that impacts to the
13 communities are appropriately mitigated in accordance with federal and
14 California law.
 - 15 • Provide a public forum and make recommendations to the Board to assist the
16 Port in taking a leadership role in creating balanced communities in
17 Wilmington, Harbor City, and San Pedro so that the quality of life is
18 maintained and enhanced by the presence of the Port.

19 The PCAC provides a public forum to discuss Port-related quality of life issues
20 through a series of subcommittees. These subcommittees provide guidance on
21 environmental issues, review of Environmental Impact Reports (EIRs), master
22 planning, and Port redevelopment. The specific purpose of this Appendix to the
23 TraPac Project is to document the involvement of the PCAC in the preparation and
24 review of this Draft EIS/EIR.

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C.2 Overview of PCAC Involvement

26 This Appendix documents PCAC members' involvement in the review of Berths
27 136-147 Terminal Project. Using the Cabrillo Way Marina Phase II EIR as a model

1 and working with the Berth 97-109 Container Terminal (China Shipping) EIR [Past
 2 EIR] subcommittee, a generalized approach was identified for PCAC involvement in
 3 preparation of EIRs and a template was developed to document this involvement.

4 PCAC also developed a number of project mitigation measures. These measures are
 5 presented in Appendix B. In addition, a list of aesthetic project mitigation measures
 6 was submitted by PCAC.

 11 letters were received, including from PCAC. A Special Public Notice was released
 12 on March 7, 2006 and a public meeting was held on April 26, 2006. One letter was
 13 received from the PCAC on the Special Public Notice.

15 Once the Draft EIS/EIR is released, Port staff will meet with the Wilmington PCAC
 16 subcommittee to review the contents of the document in accordance with the process.
