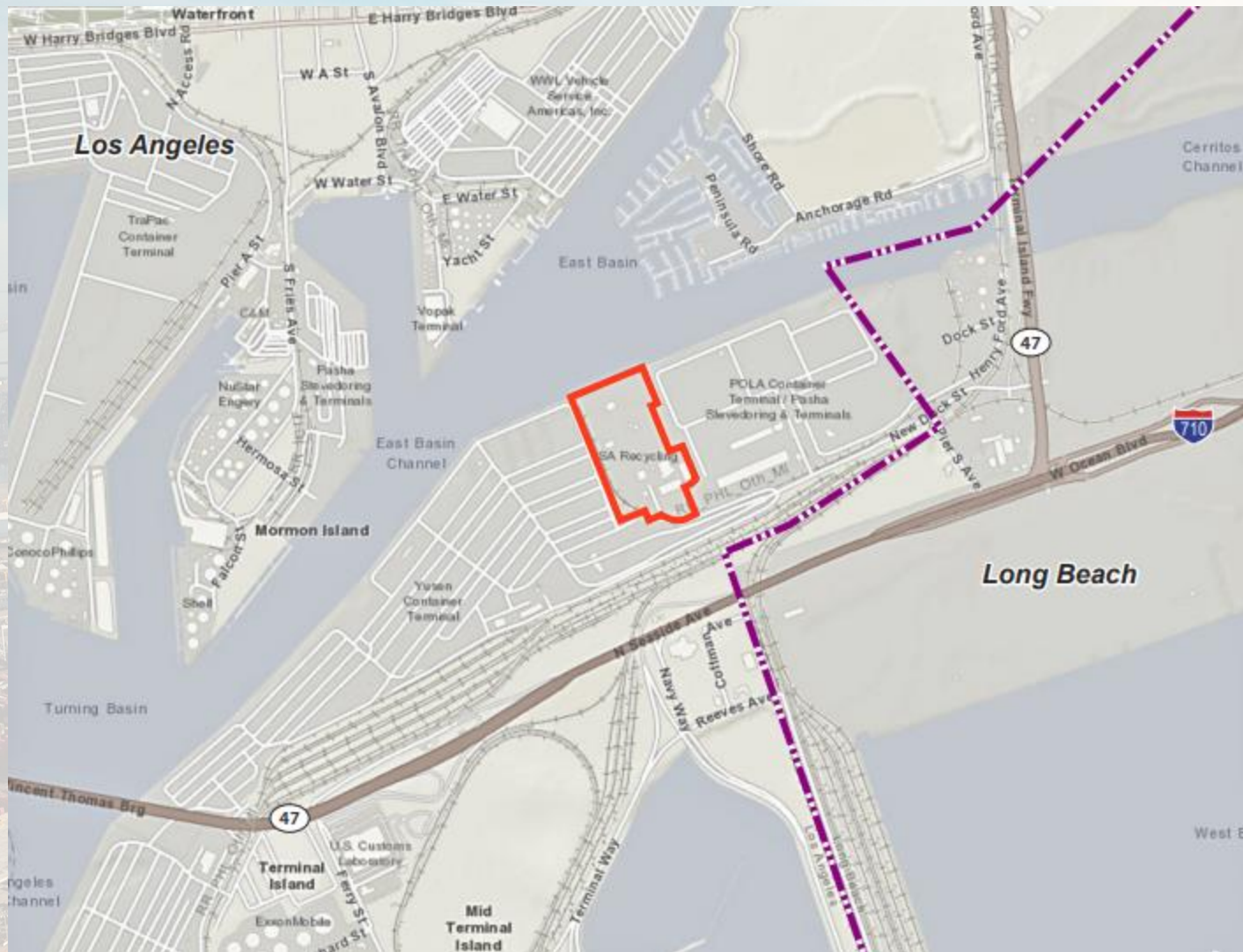

PROJECT OVERVIEW



- SA Recycling is seeking an amendment to the existing Permit No. 750 to allow for up to 10 additional years of operation as a scrap metal recycling facility (Phase 1) and up to 5 additional years thereafter for any required restoration of the site (Phase 2)

Phase 1

- No change in use or expansion of operations than what was previously actualized in the baseline Fiscal Year 2021/2022 (1.2 million gross tons)

Phase 2

- Demolition/dismantling of structures and buildings
- Ship recycled metals
- Concrete demolition (flat slab and foundations)
- Soil removal, import, and regrading
- Haul residual crushed concrete
- Import suitable ground cover

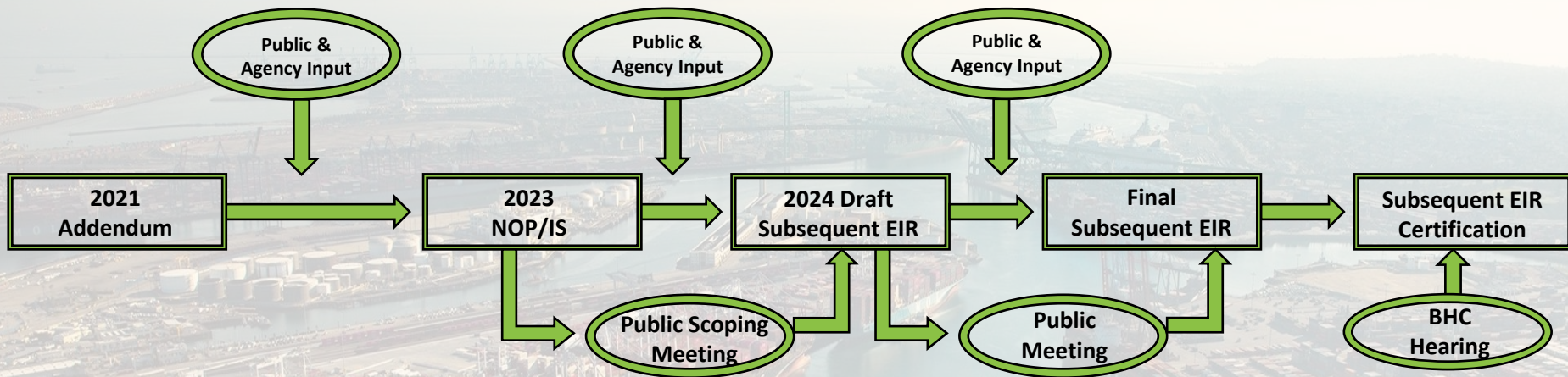

FINDINGS IN THE SEIR

- Air Quality and Meteorology
 - No new or substantially more severe significant impacts
- Cultural Resources
 - No new or substantially more severe significant impacts
 - Standard Conditions of approval included
- Greenhouse Gas Emissions
 - No new or substantially more severe significant impacts
- Hazards
 - No new or substantially more severe significant impacts would occur with mitigation incorporated
- Water Quality
 - No new or substantially more severe significant impacts

STANDARD CONDITIONS (SC) AND MITIGATION MEASURES (MM)

- **SC CR-1: Stop Work in the Area if Archaeological Resources are Encountered:** Stop work in the unlikely event that archaeological resources are encountered during Phase 2
- **SC CR-2: Stop Work in the Area if Human Remains are Encountered:** Stop work in the unlikely event that human remains are encountered during Phase 2
- **MM HAZ-1: Maintenance of Existing Cap:** Existing cap will continue to be maintained and inspected to ensure the cap continues to comply with the existing Waste Discharge Requirements
- **MM HAZ-2: Pre-Demolition Hazardous Materials Survey and Abatement:** Hazardous Materials survey would need to be conducted prior to deconstruction activities

RECOMMENDED ACTION

- Certify the Final Subsequent Environmental Impact Report to the Hugo Neu-Proler Lease Renewal Environmental Impact Report for the SA Recycling Amendment to Permit No. 750 Project
- Adopt the Findings of Fact
- Adopt the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program
- Approve the Proposed Project identified in the Subsequent Environmental Impact Report
- Authorize the Environmental Management Division to post a Notice of Determination with the Los Angeles County Clerk and the State Clearinghouse
