Re: SCH# 2003061153; Berth 97-109 [China Shipping] Container Terminal Project

The California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) has jurisdiction over the safety of highway-rail crossings (crossings) in California. The California Public Utilities Code requires Commission approval for the construction or alteration of crossings and grants the Commission exclusive power on the design, alteration, and closure of crossings.

The Commission Rail Crossings Engineering Section (RCES) is in receipt of the *Notice of Completion & Environmental Document Transmittal-Re-circulated DEIR* from the State Clearinghouse. RCES recommends that any traffic studies undertaken by the Harbor should also consider traffic impacts at nearby crossings, especially in the movement of tractor-trailers and storage space availability at the crossings.

Mitigation measures to consider include, but are not limited to, the planning for grade separations for major thoroughfares, improvements to existing at-grade highway-rail crossings due to increase in traffic volumes and continuous vandal resistant fencing or other appropriate barriers to limit the access of trespassers onto the railroad right-of-way.
