The Engineering Division is currently tracking a total of 123 active Capital projects representing just over \$1.3B in total project value. From a budget perspective, 121 of these projects, or roughly 98% of all projects, are currently tracking on budget.

The 2 projects that are either over budget or at risk of being over budget include:

1) Two projects for the B. 121-131 (Yang Ming) Terminal Improvements are under re-evaluation and a new term sheet is being contemplated. Additional cost escalation is required due to the continued delays in implementation. In addition, YML input has led to scope change and a corresponding cost increase for the ICTF element of the project;

Projects that are behind schedule include:

- 1) Two projects for the B. 100-102 China Shipping Terminal Improvements are delayed pending completion of a new EIR/EIS document;
- 2) Two projects for the B. 121-131 (Yang Ming) Terminal Improvements are under re-evaluation of the projects alignment with the Business Development Plan; A new proposed Term Sheet is being contemplated;
- 3) Four projects in the SNAP Program that are delayed due to a re-evaluation of the space needs of the HAB Building and the evaluation of the potential Topaz Property acquisition;
- 4) The Berth 161 Marine Ways Modification Project is delayed due to required redesign of the concrete slab.

MARCH 2016 PROJECT DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE (PDC) MEETING RESULTS

Attached for your review is the March 2016 PDC Report. This report highlights the actions taken by staff to initiate, review, and resolve items related to Harbor Department project schedules, scopes, and costs.

On March 2, 2016, the PDC met to consider four project items. Of those four items, one was budget-related and schedule-related, and three were new projects. Administrative reports related to work order and the unallocated budget line item were also reviewed. The Unallocated CIP Fund report and meeting minutes are attached for your review.

The following are the results of this meeting (detailed in Transmittal 1):

- 1) Budget-related/Schedule-related One item was submitted and was approved. The budget increase was \$3,400 and time was extended by five months.
- 2) New project related Three items were submitted and approved. The Cargo-Industrial Real Estate Division will follow up on potential cost recovery through the lease with Everport regarding the Everport Terminal concrete wharf inspection and repairs. HAB 1st floor restrooms and showers remodel was approved for up to \$55,000 for design and mold abatement only and will be reevaluated after the Topaz Building report is released.

The following summarizes the use of the Unallocated CIP Program Fund Report FY 2015/2016 (Transmittal 2).

The Board of Harbor Commissioners (Board) approved \$15,874,226 in the Fiscal Year 2015/2016 Capital Improvement Program budget for unallocated capital improvements. This budget is used to either begin new multi-year projects or fully fund projects within the current fiscal year. New projects \$100,000 or above are presented to and approved by the PDC. Projects under \$100,000 are reported to the PDC for discussion. Meeting minutes of the PDC are transmitted monthly to the Board for information.

Transmittal 2 lists the new projects that have utilized the Unallocated CIP budget for the current fiscal year to date. The following summarizes these new projects:

- 27 Deferred Maintenance projects for a total of \$5,770,396
- 16 new projects for a total of \$3,987,976
- 14 new projects less than \$100,000 for a total of \$698,280

There are various Board approved resources available to move these projects forward. These include in-house staff, on-call consultant contracts, on-call site and marine improvement contracts, annual contracts for supplies and materials to name a few. All these are approved by the Board either as part of the annual budget approval process or multi-year contracts that have received separate Board approval.

2013 BIOLOGICAL SURVERYS OF LOS ANGELES AND LONG BEACH HARBORS - SCHEDULE AND BUDGET CHANGE REQUEST

SUMMARY

On June 6, 2013, the Los Angeles Board of Harbor Commissioners approved a Cost Share Agreement with the Port of Long Beach (POLB) to perform a comprehensive study to document the current biological characteristics of the Los Angeles and Long Beach Harbors. Data from the study will be used in support of National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents, regulatory permitting, and for biological mitigation planning. The Cost Share Agreement identifies POLB as the contracting port and establishes that costs associated with the 2013 Biological Survey will be shared by the Harbor Department and the Port of Long Beach in the amount of \$528,580 and \$487,920, respectively, based on a previously-established 52%/48% split. This split is in concert with the level of surveying effort at each port. At present date, all surveys have been performed, samples have been analyzed and a draft report was submitted and commented on by staff of both ports. An extension in time is requested to allow for review and comment on the final draft by port staff and submittal of a final report by the consultant. An increase in budget is requested to cover additional in-house staff time required to review the report.

FITNESS EQUIPMENT AT THE LA WATERFRONT

SUMMARY

As part of the City of Los Angeles Harbor Department's initiative to attract visitors to the LA Waterfront as specified in The City of Los Angeles Harbor Department 2012-2017 Strategic Plan 2014 Update, the Community Relations Division is proposing to install fitness equipment at Wilmington Waterfront Park, along the Harbor Blvd Parkway and at 22nd Street Park in San Pedro. Community Relations has been working with the Engineering Division on this project including the selection of proposed equipment sites. Community Relations and the Contracts and Purchasing Division located a company, Landscape Structures, Inc., (Delano, MN), that has performed similar work for the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks at numerous parks throughout the City. Landscape Structures, Inc. has provided proposals and has an administrative agreement with National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance allowing the Harbor Department to piggyback on the contract if awarded through the Contracts and Purchasing Division and approved by the Board of Harbor Commissioners. Funding in the amount of \$200,000 is needed for equipment procurement, mobilization, excavation, construction and installation. Board approval will be requested if funding is identified. If approved, the project would be completed by June 2016.

BERTHS 226-232 EVERPORT TERMINAL CONCRETE WHARF INSPECTION AND REPAIRS

SUMMARY

The Port of Los Angeles is currently upgrading the wharf at Berths 226-232 Everport Terminal by installing a sheet pile wall and dredging to accommodate larger ships. This work is part of the 10 year lease extension previously approved by the Board of Harbor Commissioners.

During an above-water and underwater inspection of the concrete wharves, a number of areas of corrosion and other damage to the existing wharf structures were observed. In order to prevent further acceleration of damage at the Berths 226-232 wharves and extend the life of the structures, it is proposed that a wharf repair project be undertaken at a total project cost of \$ 7,500,000. This work is not part of the \$36 million Berths 226-236 (Everport) Terminal Improvements Project and is ongoing repair/restoration work necessary regardless of the wharf improvements project.

HAB 1ST FLOOR RESTROOMS & SHOWERS REMODEL

SUMMARY

This proposed project will modernize and remodel the existing Harbor Administrative Building (HAB) 1st Floor Restrooms and Showers. The project will need a City of Los Angeles Building & Safety (Building & Safety) plan check and permit that will require one American Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant shower and toilet in each restroom. This project is needed to prevent a permanent shut down of the shower rooms due to unhealthy conditions, ADA non-compliance, leaking shower pans, mold issues, and cost prohibitive maintenance as the existing 36-year-old restroom infrastructure has outlived its useful service life. Staff estimates that the total project cost will be \$420,000 and will be completed by September 30, 2017.
