Exception 4: For the purpose of assessing pilotage charges against barges, the sum of the overall length plus the overall width will be used. When the barge and tug or towboat are combined as an integrated unit, pilotage charges shall be assessed on the overall length and gross tonnage of the combined unit. [A] NOTE 1: The minimum charge for pilotage shall be: \$399.00 (c) The pilotage charges assessed for the services proffered or rendered by a port pilot are assessed in accordance with and based upon each and every one of the limitations, agreements, covenants and conditions set forth in Item 305. However, said pilotage charges do not include marine insurance insuring the vessel, her owners, master, operators and charterers against the consequences of acts, omissions or negligence of the port pilot. A copy of the insurance policy under which such insurance is available will be provided upon written request sent to the Port of Los Angeles.
