Governor Newson State of Emergency August & September 2020 - Heat Events. Vessels arriving between 8/17/20 to 8/20/20 until 8/24/20, and between 9/4/20 to 9/8/20 until 9/11/20 were ordered to reduce electrical power demand due to extreme stress on California's electrical grid. Vessel calls during these times were given exemptions by the emergency order to CARB At- Berth regulation pursuant to an "emergency event". A total of 24 container ships called during the emergency events (August = 11 calls; September = 13 calls). Overall AMP percentage from January to December 2020 would be 80% if the 24 ship calls were excluded.
