**ISSUED: LEVEL I COASTAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT NO. 20-04 TO CHEVRON
PIPE LINE COMPANY FOR PIPELINE REMOVAL AND ABANDONMENT
NEAR CHANNEL STREET.**

BACKGROUND

In accordance with the approved Port of Los Angeles Master Plan (PMP), the Executive Director is designated with the authority to approve or deny applications for Level I Coastal Development Permits (CDP), but these CDPs only become effective when the permits are reported in writing to the Board of Harbor Commissioners (Board). No Board action is required. Additionally, the PMP provides that a Level I CDP that is being reported to the Board can be stayed if any two Board members so request. In this case, the CDP would be agendized for the next regular Board meeting and would require Board action to be approved or denied.

PERMIT ACTIONS

The Executive Director issued Level I CDP No. 20-04 on July 20, 2020.

CDP No. 20-04 Chevron Pipe Line Company – Pipeline Removal and Abandonment near Channel Street

The project location for the approved CDP is identified on the attached map (Transmittal 1).

COASTAL PERMIT CONTEXT

CDP No. 20-04 (Transmittal 2) allows Chevron Pipe Line Company to abandon approximately 150 feet and remove approximately 400 feet of seven idle pipelines that cross under the Harbor Freeway (I-110) and the rail near West Channel Street and West John S. Gibson Boulevard. The pipelines range from 6 to 12 inches in diameter and carried crude oil and refined products between tank farms and waterfront terminals including

Navy fueling facilities in the Outer Harbor. These pipelines have been idle for more than 30 years, following the closure of the aboveground facilities they served.

The Director of the Environmental Management Division has determined that the proposed action is statutorily exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with Section 15282(k) of the State CEQA Guidelines.

The estimated project cost of \$41,000 will be paid by Chevron Pipe Line Company.
