On November 29, 2017, the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) released a Grant Solicitation and Application Package entitled “Sustainable Freight Transportation Projects” under the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program (ARFVTP). This grant solicitation was an offer to fund projects that demonstrate medium- and/or heavy-duty advanced vehicle technologies at California seaports. The grant solicitation announced that there is a total of \$27,036,799 available for the agreements resulting from this solicitation and that the Energy Commission, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to increase or reduce the amount of funds available.

The attached table, “Notice of Proposed Awards”, identifies each applicant selected and recommended for funding by Energy Commission staff and includes the amount of recommended funding and score.
