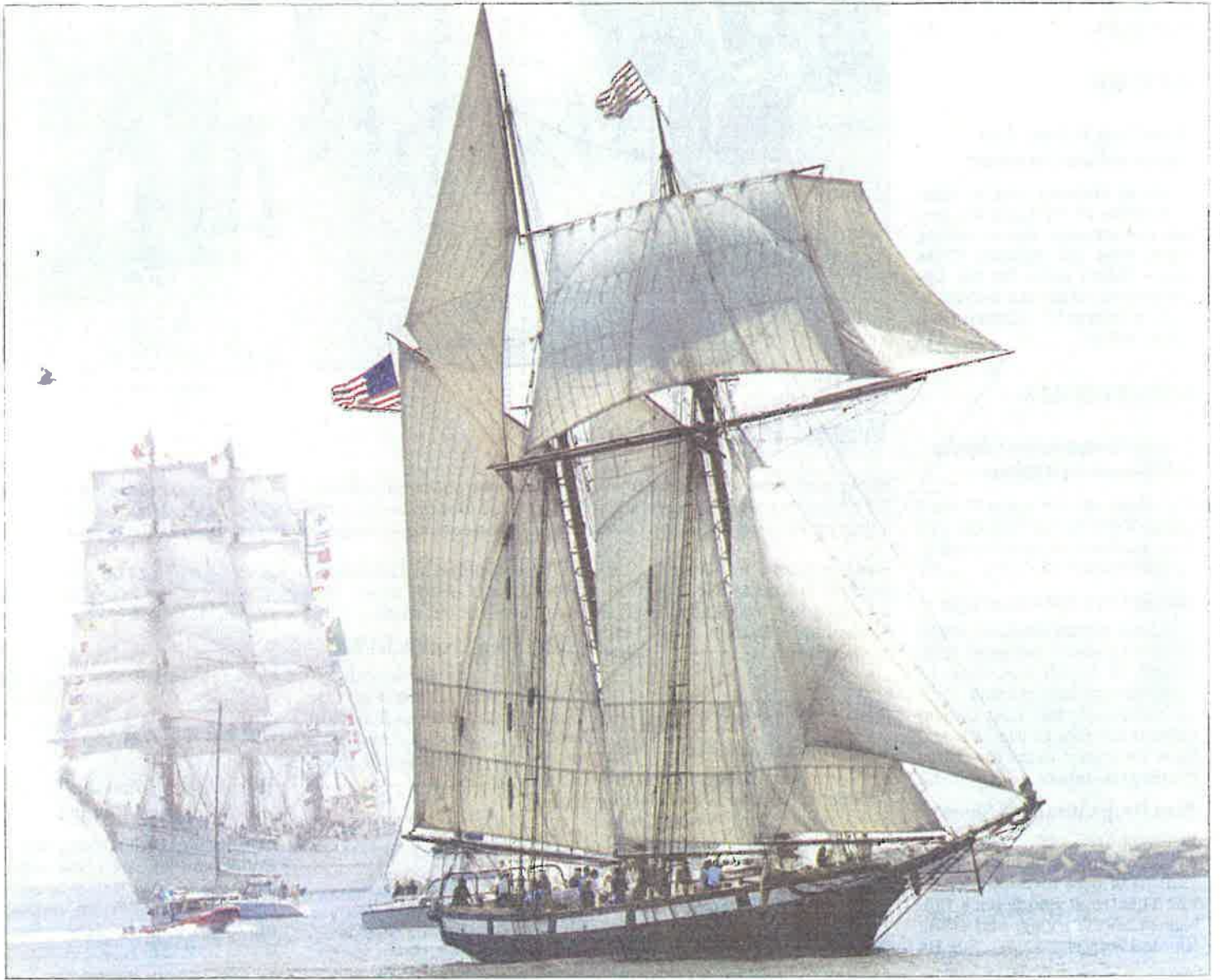

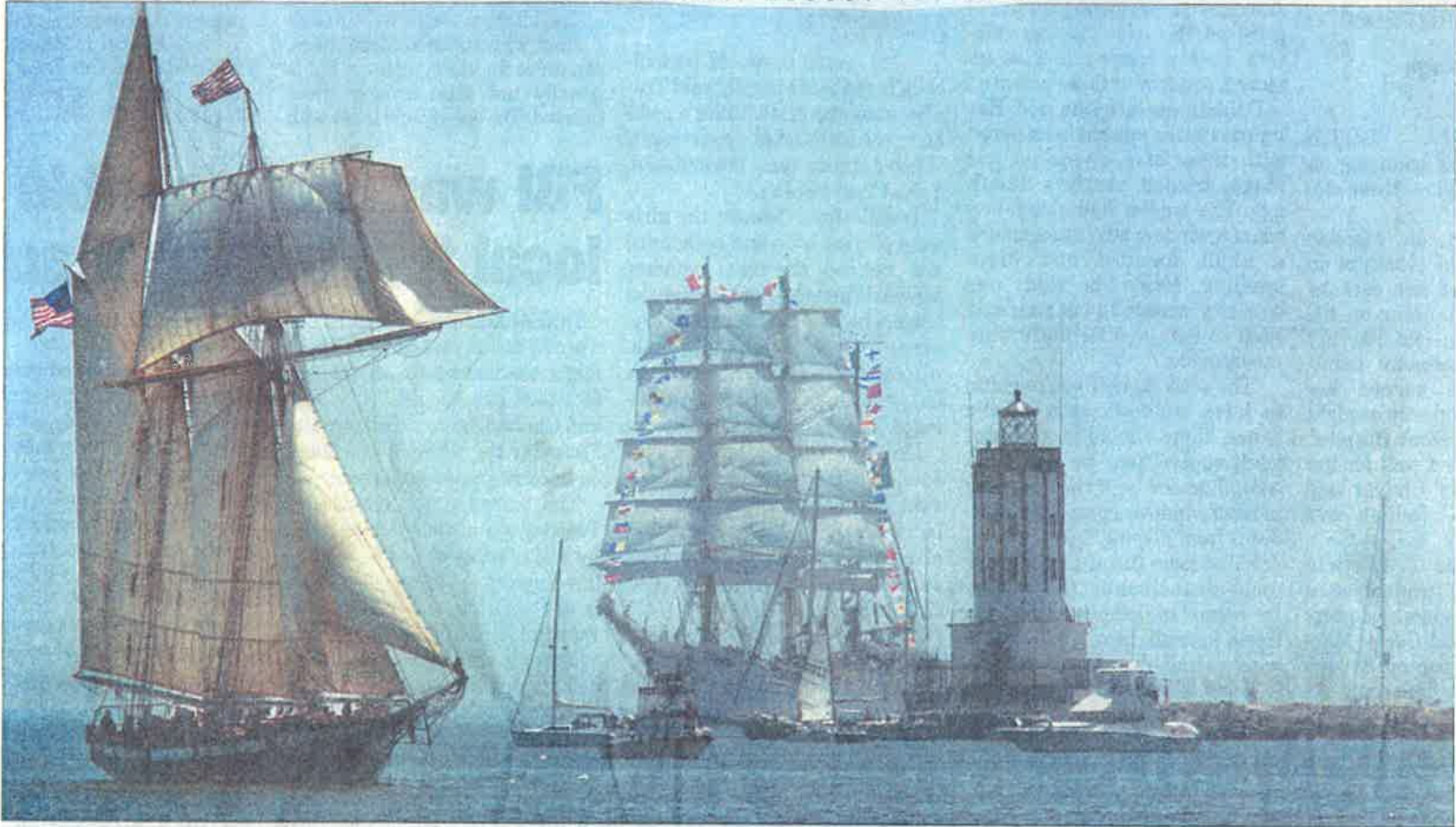

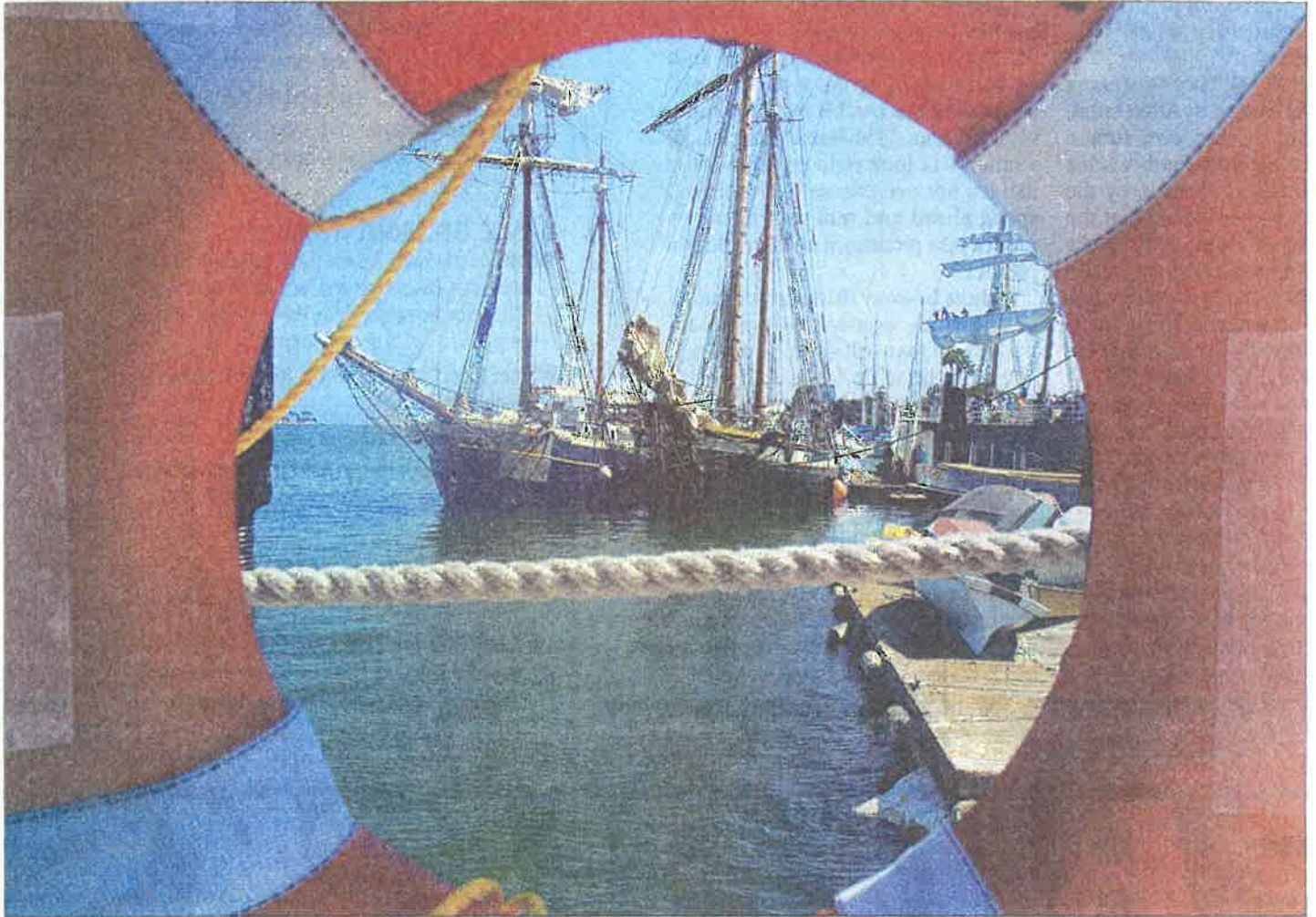

# Tall ships: 'Romance ... from a bygone era'

**SAN PEDRO:** Vessels arrive for festival that provides a chance to board or ride the crafts — and come away with a lasting impression.

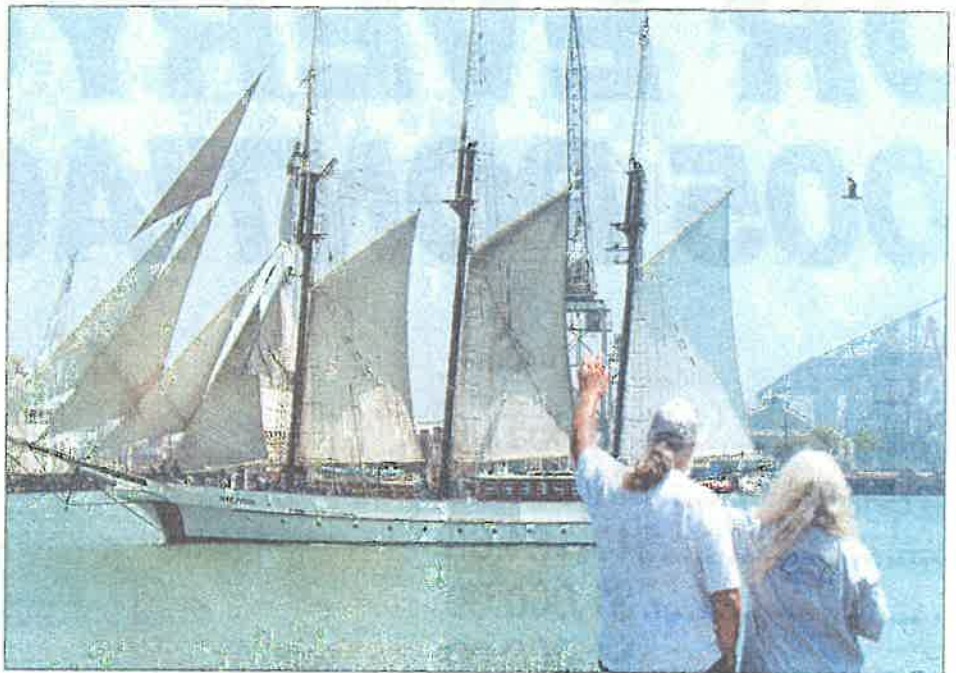

One by one, they appeared like ghosts on the horizon — wooden ships from another era, white sails billowing in the wind. Gathering off the coast of San Pedro in the early morning fog, they slowly made their way through the gentle waters, where thousands of spectators greeted their arrival with waves and shouts.

The 15 tall ships that sailed through the port's main harbor Thursday were members of the largest armada of such vessels ever to come to town. Their arrival kicked off a four-day event designed to draw people to the harbor with the chance of
