LEVEL I COASTAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT REPORT

**TO: HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF HARBOR
COMMISSIONERS**

BACKGROUND

In accordance with the approved Port of Los Angeles Master Plan (PMP), the Executive Director is designated with the authority to approve or deny applications for Level I Coastal Development Permits (CDP), but these CDPs only become effective when the permits are reported in writing to the Board of Harbor Commissioners (Board). No Board action is required. Additionally, the PMP provides that a Level I CDP that is being reported to the Board can be stayed if any two Board members so request. In this case, the CDP would be agendized for the next regular Board meeting and would require Board action to be approved or denied.

PERMIT ACTIONS

The Executive Director has approved one Level I CDP:

CDP No. 19-01 Cirque du Soleil America, Inc. – Use of the Battleship Iowa Parking Lot from March 25, 2019 through June 7, 2019 to Construct, Operate, and Maintain a Temporary Live Entertainment Facility for the show “Amaluna”

The project location for the approved CDP is identified on the attached map (Transmittal 1).

CDP No. 19-01 Cirque du Soleil America, Inc. - Use of the Battleship Iowa Parking Lot from March 25, 2019 through June 7, 2019 to Construct, Operate, and Maintain a Temporary Live Entertainment Facility for the show “Amaluna”

CDP No. 19-01 (Transmittal 2) allows Cirque du Soleil America, Inc. (Cirque) to construct, operate, and maintain a temporary live entertainment facility for the circus performance “Amaluna,” as outlined in the Application for Port Permit (APP) No. 181126-184. Cirque will utilize approximately 4.7 acres of land at Berths 88-89, located in the parking lot of

the Battleship Iowa, as approved under Temporary Entry and Use Permit (TEUP) No. 1715. The equipment Cirque will have on site includes but is not limited to three tents, bleachers, portable restrooms, generators, lights, sound system components, and a stage. Cirque will remove any and all of its property, and restore the premises to the same or as good condition at the time of the first occupancy thereof by Cirque, which will include but is not limited to minor pavement repairs.

The Environmental Management Division has completed an Environmental Assessment to assess the potential environmental impacts of the proposed Cirque event and determined that it is categorically exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with Article III Class 1(1) and 4(6) of the Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines.

Cirque will pay rent to the Harbor Department for the premises during the TEUP term in the amount of \$143,552.
