RESPONSES TO COMMENTS

2.1 Distribution of the Draft SEIS/SEIR

The Draft SEIS/SEIR prepared for the LAHD was distributed to the public and regulatory agencies on May 28, 2008 for a 60-day review period. Approximately 150 copies of the Draft SEIS/SEIR were distributed to various government agencies, organizations, individuals, and Port tenants. In addition, postcards in English and Spanish were mailed to all addresses in Wilmington and San Pedro. On June 26, 2008, the 60-day review period was extended to August 13, 2008, for a total of 75 days. Notice of this change was made by e-mail, announced at public meetings and was noticed on the first page of the Port's web site. The 75-day public review period on the Draft SEIS/SEIR officially closed on August 13, 2008. LAHD, in cooperation with USACE, held a public hearing on the Draft SEIS/SEIR on June 26, 2008, in the Port of Los Angeles Board Room to provide an overview of the proposed Pacific L.A. Marine Terminal Project and accept public comments on the proposed Project and environmental document.

2.2 Comments on the Draft SEIS/SEIR

The public comment and response component of the NEPA/CEQA process serves an essential role. It allows the respective lead agencies to assess the impacts of a project based on the analysis of other responsible, concerned, or adjacent agencies and interested parties, and it provides the opportunity to amplify and better explain the analysis that the lead agencies have undertaken to determine the potential environmental impacts of a project. To that extent, responses to comments are intended to provide complete and thorough explanations to commenting agencies and individuals and to improve the overall understanding of the project for the decision-making body.

The USACE and LAHD received 102 comment letters on the Draft SEIS/SEIR during the public review period. Table 2-1 presents a list of those agencies, organizations, and individuals who provided comment on the Draft SEIS/SEIR.
