SUBJECT: RESOLUTION NO. _____ - MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES AND THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES HARBOR DEPARTMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024 URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE GRANT PROGRAM

SUMMARY:

Staff requests approval to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the City of Los Angeles (City), for the reimbursement of funds allocated to the City of Los Angeles Harbor Department (Harbor Department) under the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program. If approved, the proposed Federal award will be for \$1,333,333 with an award date of September 1, 2024.

Under the terms of the proposed MOA, the Harbor Department will receive a reimbursement of \$1,000,000 for expenses incurred for the maintenance of the Land Mobile Radio Upgrade Project, and \$333,333 for the City of Los Angeles Inter-RF Subsystem Interface (ISSI) Connectivity Project, totaling \$1,333,333. The award is for a three-year period ending May 31, 2027. There is no cost share required under this FY 2024 UASI Grant Program. The Harbor Department will be financially responsible for initial payment of expenses to be reimbursed under this MOA.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Harbor Commissioners (Board):

1. Find that the Director of Environmental Management has determined that the proposed action is administratively exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Article II Section 2(f) of the Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines;
2. Approve the Grant Award between the City of Los Angeles Harbor Department and the City of Los Angeles for the reimbursement of funds allocated to the Harbor Department under the Fiscal Year 2024 Urban Area Security Initiative;
3. Authorize the Executive Director to execute and the Board Secretary to attest to the Obligating Document for the Award;
4. Authorize the City of Los Angeles Harbor Department to implement the project approved for funding by the City of Los Angeles; and
5. Adopt Resolution No. _____ accepting the Grant Award for UASI FY 2024.

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DISCUSSION:

Background/Context: On October 5, 2023, the Harbor Department, through an Information Memo (Transmittal 1), advised the Board that the Port Police would be applying for a project under the FY 2024 UASI Grant Program. On September 12, 2024, the Mayor's Office submitted a letter (Transmittal 2) to the Los Angeles City Council requesting submission of the UASI FY 2024 Grant Program and that \$1,333,333 be allocated to the Port Police Division on behalf of the Harbor Department. On June 18, 2025, the Council adopted the UASI FY 2024 grant, which has no cost share and is 100% reimbursable. The Mayor's Office will act as a fiduciary agent.

The Harbor Department will use \$1,000,000 of the grant funds to maintain the existing Land Mobile Radio System, which provides a direct connection and interoperability with neighboring agencies throughout Los Angeles County. The maintenance consists of access to a 24/7 technical support desk, on-site support, annual preventive maintenance, network hardware repair, 24/7 security monitoring, and network updates.

The Harbor Department will use \$333,333 of the grant funds to establish ISSI Connectivity to enhance interoperability between the Port Police, the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), and Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) to meet the communication needs of the three City agencies. This interoperability will extend the Port Police radio coverage City-wide, which is essential for coordinating a multi-agency response and communicating effectively during mutual aid incidents or planned events.

Requests for changes, including but not limited to extensions and change in scope, will be submitted to the Mayor's Office for approval. The UASI Grant Award is a reimbursement grant and includes a number of terms and conditions that must be followed for the grant recipient to be reimbursed. Port Police is responsible for and will comply with the conditions of the Grant Award.

The terms and conditions for this grant are the Department of Homeland Security Standard Terms and Conditions and California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) Standard Assurances and are listed in the MOA (Transmittal 3). The assurances for this grant include cost principles, audit requirements, administrative requirements, and reporting requirements as follows:

The Harbor Department, using existing staff, shall comply with the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996, as implemented by 2 C.F.R. Part 200, "Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards".

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT:

The proposed action is the approval of an MOA with the City for reimbursement of funds for the UASI Grant Program, which is an administrative activity. Therefore, the Director of

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Environmental Management has determined that the proposed action is administratively exempt from the requirements of CEQA in accordance with Article II Section 2(f) of the Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Approval of the proposed MOA will enable the Harbor Department to receive a reimbursement totaling \$1,333,333 for expenses incurred for the maintenance of the Land Mobile Radio Upgrade Project and the City of Los Angeles ISSI Connectivity Project. FY 2025-26 funding in the amount of \$1,000,000 is available within Account 541035 (Operating Equipment Maintenance), Division 52010 (Port Police); and \$333,333 is available within Account 161305 (Construction in Progress), Division 00000 (Harbor Global), Project 2581000 (Port Police – Land Mobile Radio System Enhancement). Reimbursements under the proposed MOA will be recorded within Account 602000 (Federal Grants – Non-Operating), Division 00000 (Harbor Global).

CITY ATTORNEY:

The Office of the City Attorney has reviewed and approved the proposed MOA as to form and legality.
