SAN PEDRO, Calif. – On Thursday, September 28, the Port of Los Angeles will hold a public meeting on the planned Southwest Marine buildings demolition project. The 6:30 p.m. meeting will take place in the Board of Harbor Commissioners Hearing Room in the Port Administration Building, 425 S. Palos Verdes Street in San Pedro.

The public meeting is part of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report (DEIS/EIR) process. The public will be informed of the potential significant environmental effects of the proposed project, and public comment on the project will be taken and documented for consideration in the Final Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report (FEIS/EIR). The comment period closes on October 23.

All members of the community are invited to attend this public meeting and give their comments on the project.
